NARD REPORT

NARD Conference: Reynolds and Raffety reported on the NARD Conference.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Executive Committee: A committee meeting for the Executive Committee will be set.

Planning Committee: Thorburn reported on the landowner steering committee meetings for May and Elk Creek Townships. Elk Creek Steering Committee would like to exclude a well that has a variable irrigation history (because it skews the data) and include dedicated observation wells. Observation well data would have to be statistically correlated to average levels of local irrigation data because the wells haven't been measured for as long of a timespan. The committee asked for a higher allocation in exchange for a longer allocation period.

The May Township Steering Committee, TBNRD Planning Committee, Thorburn, Mike Onnen and two LBNRD directors met to discuss declines in May Township. There was discussion about new development and different groundwater quantity requirements in LBNRD and the effect on May Township water levels. The May Township landowners expressed concern that trends in water levels in their township were beyond their control because of less stringent requirements in LBNRD regulations. The landowners suggested hiring a hydrologist and Thorburn suggested working with LBNRD to standardize regulations. Thorburn commented that LBNRD's saturated thickness map for Adams County differs from TBNRD's in Kearney County. Thorburn and Little are examining TBNRD's data to see if there are any issues. Reynolds mentioned that TBNRD's goal is 'sustainability of the aquifer' and wondered if LBNRD has the same goal. Thorburn will check. The board expressed the desire to work with LBNRD to make groundwater level regulations more compatible. Thorburn commented that developing the Joint Little Blue IMP would be a good place to start. Reynolds suggested an ad hoc committee for the Little Blue Basin be implemented. The following people volunteered to be on the committee: Cavanaugh, Ryan, Lundeen and Raffety.
