TBNRD will be reimbursed for one third of \$41,686 by the Environmental Trust (\$13,756). Garrelts ask that Thorburn get the amount of actual credit TBNRD will receive for the diversion.

Development Corp, is asking TBNRD to contribute \$10,000, which could be spread over five years. Garrelts asked that this be discussed in executive session for protection of public as a contractual matter. Chairman Nickel referred this item to Executive Committee for review.

Consider Request from URNRD for Participation in 40th Anniversary Promo Campaign: URNRD has proposed a radio campaign for participation in 40th anniversary promotional campaign for \$5,000 over a 12 week period to be budgeted next fiscal year. Reynolds asked that the matter be sent to executive committee. Reynolds asked for more information about the message. Nelson commented the money should be used locally.

Consider Proposal to Revise Phase 3 GW Quality Management Rules: Thorburn explained the proposed change would allow fall fertilization in Phase III areas if a nitrification inhibitor is used. UBBNRD is adopting a similar but more restrictive policy. Lundeen asked that Ray Ward be consulted. Nickel suggested adding to the Planning Committee agenda.

Projects & Construction Recommendation to Revise Tree Cost-Share Policy: This agenda items was discussed earlier.

Correct Certified Acres for KAAPA Ethanol Plant: Thorburn explained that the Kearney Co. Assessor asked for certified irrigated acres from TBNRD for KAAPA. The Assessor is going to assess based on land use. TBNRD has 134 certified acres on record but there are only 125.6 actual acres. A reduction in acres would be a reduction to the baseline. <u>Moved by Olsen, seconded by Bergstrom to correct KAAPA's certified acres from 144 to 125.6. Motion carried.</u>
