**Consider Whether to Proceed to Final Design with Platte-Republican Diversion Project:** Thorburn briefly explained the scope of the project. Olsson and Associates completed the Feasibility Study, which shows a positive cost to benefit ratio, and it was released to the public. Measure are needed for erosion problems in the upper reach. Thorburn calculated that CNPPID would charge \$44/af for delivery of the water with an overall cost of \$81/af for the project over 20 years. Ford commented that the canal is adequately sized to operate during irrigation season, but a bottleneck would be Johnson Lake and Elwood Reservoir. Operation of the diversion is dependent upon Elwood having water to divert.
