Consider Whether to Assist with Replacing Culvert on Lost Creek at Hwy 44: Thorburn reported that the culvert runs under Hwy 44 at Lost Creek was installed in the 1960's but the Nebraska Department of Roads has no record of the installation. The repair isn't a priority for the Nebraska Department of Roads. Thorburn asked the board if they would consider the project and how it would be funded. Garrelts stated that it would set a precedent if TBNRD would pay for the project. Reynolds suggested sending the project to the Projects & Construction Committee, talking to the County Road Dept., and get an estimate. Johnson suggested researching who installed the project and Bilka suggested getting landowners involved.
