GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT

Groundwater, Certified Acre Transfers & WCIP - Thorburn presented five irrigated acre transfers requests to approve (Charity Fields (2) and Evans (3)) and a WCIP application for D&B Wohlgemuth. Drake Johnson, Harold Smith and Josh Evans were present to answer questions. Thorburn gave an updated total of WCIP acres.

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<u>Moved by Garrelts, seconded by Raffety to approve a WCIP application (D&B Wohlgemuth) and irrigated acre transfers for Charity Field Farms (2) and Joshua Evans (3). The public was given the opportunity to bring other specific business or non-agenda items before the board for comment and/or discussion. Terry Sorensen thanked the board for the opportunity to participate in committee meetings and commented on the confusion surrounding saturated thickness with area landowners.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Consider Revising Groundwater Management Rules: Thorburn reviewed changes to the Groundwater Management Rules. Blankenau renumbered the rules and regulations and re-wrote the regulations concerning violators and cease and desist rules. Thorburn explained that this version of the rules incorporated changes recommended by the Planning Committee. Thorburn presented information on saturated thickness for each township in the Little Blue Basin that was different from the information presented at the Planning Committee Meeting because, he believes that saturated thickness should be based on an historic number, so average saturated thickness of pre-1986 wells was used in new calculations. Thorburn suggested managing the four complete townships individually and grouping partial townships because of limited data available. The Planning Committee recommended that in the Little Blue Basin only, an allocation of 40 acre-inches per acre over five years for Phase III, with the option to pool, with a five-inch bank to start the first five-year allocation. After the first five-year allocation landowners could carry over a maximum of eight inches to the next allocation period. There was discussion about saturated thickness. Sorenson commented that saturated thickness is difficult to understand and that landowners don't want to drop ten feet below 1981-1985 levels. Bergstrom commented that the other two basins are regulated by the State of Nebraska and the Republican Basin Compact, and the Little Blue Basin isn't, which gives TBNRD more latitude to set triggers. Garrelts asked for a new chart showing the actual drop in feet from the average saturated thickness. Reynolds commented that he is reluctant to approve a trigger based on saturated thickness because he doesn't believe the ramifications are fully understood. There was discussion about the difference between pre-1986 average saturated thickness and the numbers presented at the Planning Committee meeting.

Moved by Reynolds, seconded by Grimes, to approve the changes to the Groundwater Management Rules and Regulations for hearing except for the changes related to the Little Blue Basin (8.2.C.I). Grimes offered a friendly amendment to the following motion that saturated thickness be reduced from 10% to 5% which failed for lack of second.

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Moved by Ryan, seconded by Bilka, to approve the changes to the Groundwater Management Rules and Regulations as recommended by the Planning Committee and revised by Blankenau and hold a public hearing. Motion failed.
