Review, Select Bids for Cottonwood Ranch Augmentation Project Well Construction: Thorburn presented a spreadsheet of the bids for the well drilling and pipeline installation. Thorburn noted that all three bids for pipeline construction didn't meet bid specifications. Two didn't complete the forms correctly and one didn't attend the required meeting. There was discussion about dewatering costs, which were not included in the bid specs. There was discussion about how to proceed with the bidding for the pipeline construction. Garrelts suggested having J-G Dirt Works and Midlands Contracting rework their bids to specs. Thorburn said he would have to consult with legal counsel. Thorburn stated that Myers Construction would not be contacted because they failed to attend the required meeting.

Dicke mentioned that excess flow information is available in the PRD feasibility report.
