Discuss Groundwater Quality Issues in Nebraska: Thorburn presented nitrate data for TBNRD highlighting the Phase III areas. Thorburn commented that Phase III regulations have lowered nitrate levels. There was discussion about how to increase awareness in TBNRD about groundwater quality. It was suggested to form a committee made up of agronomists and other agencies and to investigate developing a nitrogen demonstration plot. Garrelts commented that costs associated with a demonstration plot would need to be added to the next FY budget.
