Review Contract /NDNR for Water Resources Cash Fund: Thorburn explained that \$200,000 is available from the Water Resources Cash Fund with a match of 60/40 percent. TBNRD or landowners would need to match the 40 percent. The funding would be used for soil moisture sensors (landowner cost-share) and remote reading flowmeters (TBNRD). Funding can only be used for projects in the Republican Basin with three years to spend funds. Moved by Lundeen, seconded by Grimes, approve the Water Resources Cash Fund Contract for soil moisture sensors and remote reading flowmeters in the Republican Basin. Motion carried.

Consider Pilot Program for Certified Irrigated Acre Suspension: Thorburn explained the program that would allow landowners to enter into an agreement with a solar contractor and suspend the irrigation status for a set period. The Executive Committee recommended a one-year, self-renewing contract. The program will be introduced as a pilot program. Moved by Lundeen, seconded by Grimes, to accept the Executive Committee's recommendation to establish a pilot program for the suspension of irrigated acres with a one-year, auto-renew term. Motion carried.

Review Recharge Agreement with Re-Use Pit, Wetland Owners: Thorburn explained the Executive Committee recommended selecting five, tier-one reuse pits for a pilot program. Landowners would receive a \$2,000 one-time payment on a 10-year lease. Lundeen suggested publicizing the pilot program. Moved by Larson, seconded by Ryan, to accept the Executive Committee recommendation to establish a pilot program on five, tier-one re-use pits and offer a one-time \$2,000 payment with a ten-year term. Motion carried.
